let me come in.”

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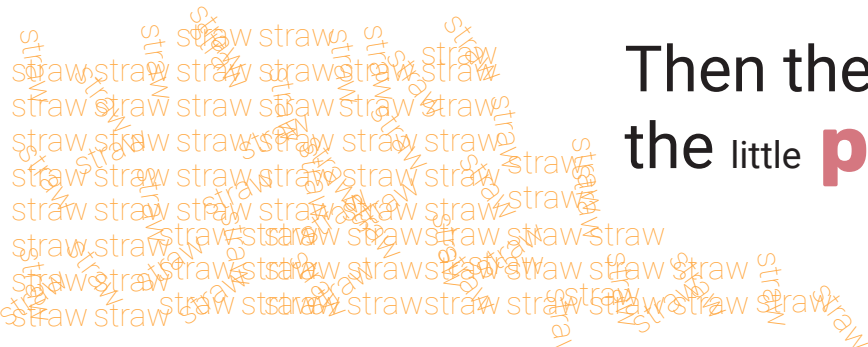

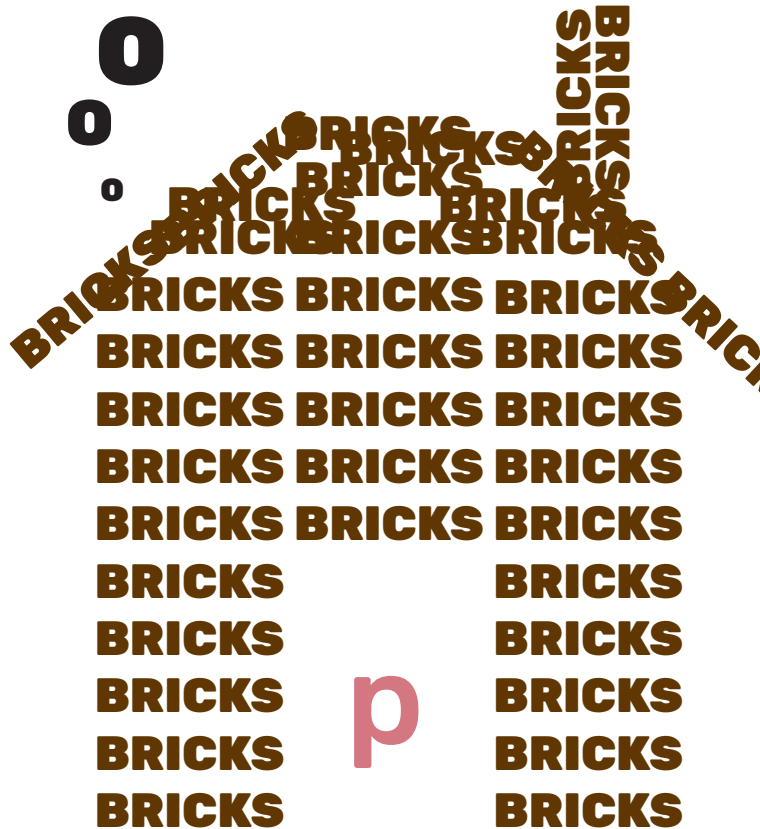

for dinner.”

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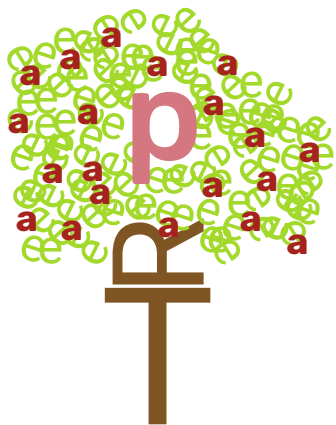
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The WOLF said, “little pig,
